Philadelphia - Headquarters Health Care Liability October 1, 2023

The plaintiff filed wrongful death and survival actions against the defendants, asserting claims of negligence and corporate negligence. Case Law Alerts, 4th Quarter, October 2023 is prepared by Marshall Dennehey to provide information on recent developments of interest to our readers.

Pennsylvania Superior Court affirmed trial court's dismissal of case because appellant waived her substantive claims by not moving to strike the non pros prior to appealing.

The appellant initiated a lawsuit, pro se, raising negligence and strict liability claims arising out of allegedly negligent treatment received for gastrointestinal symptoms. The plaintiff was injured at work, herniating discs in her spine. She underwent an anterior cervical discectomy and fusion procedure performed by the defendant, Dr. Salkind. Only an affirmative misrepresentation or fraudulent concealment of the actual medical cause of death will toll the two-year statute of limitations for survival or wrongful death cases.

The trial court granted a defendant's motion for summary judgment in a wrongful death case because the matter was initiated after MCARE's two-year statute of limitations period had run.
