# **OVERVIEW**

The project received the Miami Law's HOPE public interest Resource Center's "Innovative Service in the Public Interest Award". In addition, Carla worked on the Human Rights Clinic's Time's Up project, where she focused on employment discrimination law to assist in combating sexual harassment against low-wage, women, immigrant workers. In this work, she was able to co-author and submit a report concerning migrant workers' experiences related to workplace sexual harassment, on behalf of Miami Law's Human Rights Clinic, for the United Nation's Universal Periodic Review in 2020.

Carla has been recognized in the Miami Law's HOPE Pro Bono Challenge for completing more than 75 hours of legal-related pro bono service while in law school. She has volunteered for many different organizations and projects, for example, she worked for "Protect the People Clinic" and conducted legal screening for immigration cases with Florida Immigrant Coalition and Americans for Immigrant Justice. In addition, she has volunteered in gathering data for the Fines and Fees Justice Center.
